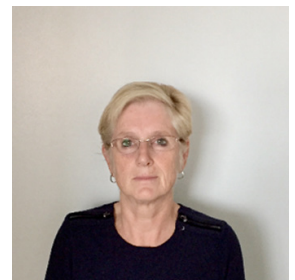
Mark Thompson (Trustee)
